Calendar Review

Ted reviewed the upcoming activities listed on the attached meeting agenda.

Previous Meeting Minutes

Dennis reviewed the minutes of the November 2012 meeting. There was no business meeting held in December. Printed copies of the minutes were available at the meeting. The minutes are available in the Members section of the troop website.

Action Item Report

November 2012 - Bill Fournet obtained all needed information on the Zink Ranch project.

Treasurer's Report – Randy McGuire

Randy provided the Treasurer's Report, dated January 31, 2013. The package included a September 2012 Receipts and Expenditures Report, a October – December 2012 Receipts and Expenditures Report, a Scout Accounts Summary, a Campout Summary – Sept to Dec 2012, and a Cash Status Report as of 12/31/2012. The report package is included as an attachment to this document. Randy summarized the reports and led the discussion. Lettered callouts highlight notable items.

Bill Fournet asked about the income level related to the Webelos Weekends. Randy will provide more detail.

Fall 2012 Blue and Gold Sale

\$4417 to scout accounts. 55 scouts participated. This was the troop's biggest B&G sale. Seven scouts sold over \$1000. The troop will receive \$260 plus the bonus in January.

2012 Popcorn Sale

\$4258 to scouts. \$1002 to troop but it should be \$1759. \$555 remains uncollected. 41 scouts participated. Eli Smith sold \$1600 which yielded \$401 profit. Tom and Logan Steele sold \$5180.

2013 Jamboree

Six scouts have paid less than \$500 and may be at risk for dropping out. The collections in January were adequate to cover the January \$28,000 payment.

151 scouts and 90 adults were rechartered for 2013. There were many difficulties in getting all of the adults to update their Youth Protection Training.

\$1973 was transferred from dormant scout accounts to the General Fund. This transfer is accomplished at the end of each year.

Following a motion by Rick and a second from Dick, the report was approved unanimously.

Randy will follow-up on disbursal of 2010 Jambo refunds and Camp Alexander withdrawals on the Cash Status Report.

Chairman Notes and Issues

Ted offered thanks to those shown on the meeting agenda. Also mentioned were Randy McGuire, Rick Hayes, Ray Yarroll, John Points and Jim Gonders for their work to recharter the troop and crew.

Ted read a "CURRENT NEWS RELEASE" statement. A copy of his statement and those from BSA and the Indian Nations Council are attached. Ted will monitor the situation and proposed action by the troop Executive Committee if and when any is needed. There was a short discussion at this point and more near the end of the meeting were several of the members expressed their personal opinions.

Scoutmaster's Report – Bill Shaffer

The next Court of Honor is Feb 25th. There will be four Eagle Scouts and several troop medals will be presented.

The council Silver Beaver and Eagle Scout banquet is Feb 23rd. 22 of our 31 2012 Eagle Scouts have not responded to the invitation. Bill will divide the list for individual phone calls. Randy is collecting table reservations.

Eagle District Spring Camporee. Our participation is unsure. There will still be a fall WOW but this is also being called a Webelos Weekend. This event, held at Camp Garland, will focus on advancement and training. Shooting sports, climbing, and the zip line will be active. Todd Wagner is doing a good job as the Activities Chair for the district.

Summer Camp – It is time to get going. Randy will send a payment schedule email. Troop 103, the new unit at Sts Peter and Paul, has been invited to camp with us.

The White Stag Leadership Course has started. Parker Brock is the SPL. Bill Fournet helped prepare and donated the books. Bill Shaffer has been asked to design a neckerchief and patch. The course now includes three levels. No additional funding is needed at this time. 19 scouts applied, 12 will be selected. It will be held from 1830 to 1915 on seven Mondays and include a campout exercise. The BSA Patrol Leader Handbook and other similar resources are being used. A "ticket" process may be used in the third level.

Feb 11th has been chosen for the Tulsa Public Schools project. We will be building safety preparation kits for the classroom. More information and the location will be announced.

Bill announced Jim Denny has pancreatic cancer. Treatment is underway. Jim will be honored as a Distinguished Eagle Scout at the council banquet.

Melinda Stinnett will receive the Silver Beaver Award. Bill was part of the SB selection committee. All recipients were worthy with many overdue for the award.

JJ Jorische and Bill Fournet were honored at the recent Eagle District Banquet with the District Award of Merit and the Rising Star awards respectively.

Equipment Report

Dennis Zvacek provided the Senior Quartermaster Report. A copy is attached. Some additional information was provided on the incident during an equipment workday. Four tents received minor fly damage when they blew over and rolled onto the highway. They were captured within a minute or two but the group was personally disappointed that an oversight on our part provided some risk to people on the highway. We will use all of the stakes when drying tents in the future.

National Jamboree

Planning continues with the adult team meeting every two weeks. The itinerary is maturing with a stop in Chattanooga and a white water raft trip on the way and Washington DC, Annapolis and Gettysburg on the way home. There is one scout opening that we need to fill. The medical form process is in place and will need to be monitored.

Advancement

Rick Hayes reported an encouraging start to the year. He will focus on Life Scout development this year. Fifteen Life Scouts need Camping merit badge. Next year the new merit badge requirements go into effect.

Fundraising

The spring Blue and Gold meat sale starts a little earlier this year. The idea is to be finished before spring break. Ray recognized Brenda for her work in this area and the high level of organization she applies to the project.

Bill Fournet, reporting for Christopher Smith, described the Zink Ranch debris clearing project. A copy of the project plan is attached. The council has offered \$5000 to clear the area. We are offering the project as a fund raiser for Jamboree and Sea Base participants.

Camp Card Campaign – Christopher Smith will also head this project. A plan summary is attached. Of the \$5 cost of the card, the council receives \$2.50 and the proposal is for the scout to receive \$2.00 and 50 cents to go to the troop. This project did not reconcile financially last year and Christopher is working to provide controls that will avoid any loss. Bill Fournet will work with Christopher to avoid one person carrying the full load of the project. All cards and money must be turned in by May 10th. Bill Fournet asked for approval of the plan as card orders are due on Feb 8th. Rick made a motion to approve the plan, Dennis seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

Friends of Scouting – John LaFourtune volunteered to lead our campaign this year. He will meet with Kyle Baker next week. Bill Fournet and David Hughes will provide back-up. The first collection will be on Feb 24th. Last year was a record year for the troop with the largest unit donation in the council.

During a discussion of the Court of Honor program advertisements, Bill Fournet made a motion that Bill Shaffer's notes of congratulation should be made at no charge. Ray seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

QuikTrip has inquired about our willingness to participate in another food tasting project. Ted will investigate and head up the project.

Other Business

Bill Fournet provided more information on the Medal of Honor Day celebration to be held on April 27th. The Eagle District is working with the US Marine Corps to organize the event which centers on Veterans Park. This year's ceremony will recognize Woody Williams, with General Anthony Zimmney as a primary speaker. A flag retirement will be held at 1300 with the main ceremony at 1400. There will be a military history tent, other displays, and a chance for Citizenship scout advancement. Approximately 1400 people are expected. Ray Yarroll and JJ Jorishe have agreed to coordinate concession workers for the troop.

Summer Camp

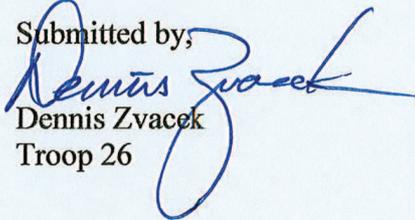
Bo is looking for some gateway help, for both planning and construction.

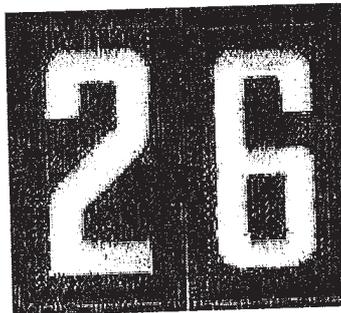

CURRENT NEWS RELEASE:

BSA has released a statement that it is reviewing its policy on gays in Scouting. BSA continues to receive pressure from without and perhaps from within to change its policy. Financial support from large corporations and charitable organizations is probably one reason this issue is being redressed. In the recent past, its position against gays in adult leadership has been adjudicated all the way to the Supreme Court and its position prevailed. Since this issue has widespread emotional support both locally and nationally on both sides of the issue, I would prefer that, for now, we limit any discussion to the truth and facts about what BSA's current policy is and not what it might be sometime in the future. If members of this committee feel they must make their feelings known before BSA may or may not officially changes its policy, you may send an email to me, Bill or any member of the executive committee and express your feelings. I encourage you not to send an eblast out on this issue at this time because it could be very divisive and moot if BSA elects to not change its policy.

If it becomes necessary in the future, I will form a subcommittee composed of Shaffer, Yarroll, Zvacek, and myself (the executive committee) and 2 members elected by the Troop Committee. The purpose of this subcommittee would be to discuss what our recommendations should be, if faced with a decision by our chartering organization (Good Shepherd Lutheran) to give up its charter of Troop 26, because of a change in National's policy, irrespective of what Troop 26's decision might be. This subcommittee would also address, when appropriate, what its recommendation to the Troop Committee would be relative to Troop 26's position on this issue given that we may be allowed by National to decide our own official position.

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MEDIA STATEMENT

Boy Scouts of America
Monday, Jan. 28, 2013

“For more than 100 years, Scouting’s focus has been on working together to deliver the nation’s foremost youth program of character development and values-based leadership training. Scouting has always been in an ongoing dialogue with the Scouting family to determine what is in the best interest of the organization and the young people we serve.

“Currently, the BSA is discussing potentially removing the national membership restriction regarding sexual orientation. This would mean there would no longer be any national policy regarding sexual orientation, and the chartered organizations that oversee and deliver Scouting would accept membership and select leaders consistent with each organization’s mission, principles, or religious beliefs. BSA members and parents would be able to choose a local unit that best meets the needs of their families.

“The policy change under discussion would allow the religious, civic, or educational organizations that oversee and deliver Scouting to determine how to address this issue. The Boy Scouts would not, under any circumstances, dictate a position to units, members, or parents. Under this proposed policy, the BSA would not require any chartered organization to act in ways inconsistent with that organization’s mission, principles, or religious beliefs.”
